The board of Independent School District No. 281 (Robbinsdate Area Schools) has proposed to revoke the school district's existing referendum revenue authorization of \$848.25 per pupil and to replace that authorization with a new authorization of \$1,360.35 per pupil. The proposed new referendum revenue authorization would increase each year by the rate of inflation and be applicable for seven years unless otherwise revoked or reduced as provided by law.
