SCHOOL DISTRICT BALLOT QUESTION 2 APPROVAL OF SCHOOL DISTRICT CAPITAL PROJECT LEVY AUTHORIZATION

The board of Independent School District No. 279 The board of Independent School District No. 279 (Osseo Area Schools) has proposed a capital project levy authorization in the amount of 3.009% times the net tax capacity of the school district to provide funds for the purchase and installation of software and technology equipment and the support and maintenance of technology. The proposed capital project levy authorization will raise approximately \$5,000,000 for taxes payable in 2009, the first year it is to be levied, and would be authorized for five years. The estimated total cost of the projects to be funded over that time period is approximately \$25,000,000. The projects to be funded nave received a positive review and comment from the Commissioner of Education. Education.
