The proposed capital project levy authorization will raise approximately \$5,000,000 for taxes payable in 2009, the first year it is to be levied, and would be authorized for five years. The estimated total cost of the projects to be funded over that time period is approximately \$25,000,000. The projects to be funded have received a positive review and cornment from the Commissioner of Education.
