PROPOSED LANGUAGE ORDINANCES
SECTION 6.00. (When Required). Subd. 3.
The Common Council may provide by ordinance
that a violation of a city ordinance is either a
misdemeanor or a petty misdemeanor
punishable in accordance with state law. In
addition, the Council may establish by ordinance
a procedure for imposing a civil penalty for each
ordinance violation. The procedure must provide
for an opportunity for a hearing before a neutral
party, which may be the Council.
