The board of Independent School District No. 877 (Buffalo-Hanover-Montrose) has proposed to increase its general education revenue by \$339 per pupil. The proposed referendum revenue authorization would increase each year by the rate of inflation and be applicable for ten years unless otherwise revoked or reduced as provided by law. Shall the increase in the revenue proposed by the board of Independent School District No. 877 be approved? Shall the Minnesota Constitution be amended to dedicate funding to protect our drinking water sources, to protect, enhance, and restore our wetlands, praines, forests, and fish, game, and wildlife habitat; to preserve our arts and cultural heritage, to support our parks and Irailis; and to protect, enhance, and restore our lakes, rivers, streams, and groundwater by increasing the sales and use tax rate beginning July 1, 2009, by three-eighths of one percent on taxable sales until the year 2034?
